

Home Dismissal:

- Temperature greater than 100.4F, may return to school after 24 hours fever free without fever reducing medication
- Any vomiting, may return to school 24 hours from last episode
- Any undiagnosed skin rash
- Two or more episodes of diarrhea, may return to school 24 hours from last episode

Covid-19: following CDC, state, local laws and guidance. Enhanced prevention strategies may be necessary in response to an outbreak

- People who have symptoms of respiratory or gastrointestinal infections, such as cough, fever, sore throat, vomiting or diarrhea, should stay home.
- Testing is recommended for people with symptoms of Covid-19 as soon as possible after symptoms begin. (Day 0 is the day symptoms appeared, and day 1 is the next full day)
- Once isolation has ended after 5 days from a positive Covid-19 test result, with improved symptoms, it is suggested to wear a mask through day 10 around others, per CDC guidelines
- Testing is not required to return to school
- If symptoms recur or worsen, then the isolation period should restart at day 0
